

We extend our deepest sympathies to all of their family and friends on their loss.




#### July Club Meeting





#### **Columbus Fourth of July Parade**

#### Parade Sign Etiquette

We used to have a set of club rules on how our membership should behave in parades, such as no throwing candy or weaving in the parade route. I would like to suggest another addition to this list, how to handle our sponsors' signs.

Our parade sponsors pay us to be in parades to promote their businesses, most of them also have to pay the parade for us to be in the parade. Some of the sponsors paid to have the signs printed that we display on our cars.

We want these signs to last as long as they can, so please take care putting on and pulling tape off these signs, so as to not tear the signs up more than they already are. It is a little bit tough having to go back to a sponsor to tell them we need them to provide us with replacement signs.

A good suggestion would be to pick up rectangle cow magnets from a store like Fleet Farm or Tractor Supply. These magnets are strong enough to secure the signs to the cars, without damaging the paper.

Obviously, if your car is made of wood, fiberglass or too much filler material was used during the restoration of your car, magnets may not work.


